The Bible Societies ´ Strange History

Apostasy is nothing new to Bible societies. They have been apostate from the very beginning in the early 19th century. Of course their apostasy has increased with the passing years, but the destructive seeds of *false doctrine* and *ecumenism* were present from the earliest days.

The *first* Bible Society was formed in 1804 in England and named the Brittish and Foreign Bible Society. According to *The History of Christianity*, published by Lion Publishing, 1977, "On 7 March 1804, at London Tavern, The Brittish and Foreign Bible Society (BFBS) was established." (p. 558)

The BFBS, which was a founding member of the United Bible Societies (UBS) in 1946, was amazingly *apostate* from its beginning. Consider a few well-documented facts regarding this group's early history.

The Brittish Bible Society *did not* allow public prayer or Bible quotations in its meetings!
